

6 Visitors takes its inspiration from the work of Luigi Pirandello's satiric play, Six Characters in Search of an Author, which was first produced in 1921. In adapting this work for TFS, I have taken into account the amazing talents of the 5A acting company and tailored it to their unique gifts, as well as reimagining the piece for a contemporary audience. It is a play-within-a-play-within-a-play, and a huge challenge for actors, as the main themes are: what effect does acting have on fellow actors and ultimately, the audience? And, in a larger sense, do any of us have control over our destiny? Playful, ridiculous, and unexpectedly shocking (the original play caused a riot on opening night!), 6 Visitors will have you debating and questioning the roles we ALL play, every day of our lives.

I would also like to thank recent TFS graduate Angelina Marjanovic for endless creative input and insight into her roles as Stage Manager, Assistant Director and the mysterious voice from the booth!
